# Mideastern Michigan Library Cooperative Director's Report August and September 2022

#### **State Budget/State Aid:**

#### State Aid FY2022

With the new State Budget, the state aid allotment will have reached the .50 per capita rate established by law. The per capita rate was established in the late 70's, so the focus will now turn to maintaining the .50 per capita rate and continuing to increase the amount for State Aid. Starting October 1, 2022, the Library of Michigan's State Aid portal will be opened. Libraries are encouraged to begin filling out the report. The deadline for submission is by February 1, 2023.

# **Cooperative Services:**

- MMLC is still experiencing issues with our email host Network Solutions. We hope to have everything resolved soon.
- The MMLC Board of Trustees approved the FY 2022-2023 Budget which includes an allocation for the Innovation and Technology Grant. The grant amounts are:

Class VI Public Libraries \$15,000 each
 Class IV and V Public Libraries \$13,000 each
 Class I, II, III Public Libraries \$11,000 each

# <u>Midwest Collaborative for Library Services (MCLS):</u> Scott Garrison, Executive Director of MCLS

• Like so many other organizations, the COVID-19 pandemic influenced MCLS to become a mostly remote work organization, and I have big news to share. On Friday, Aug. 12 the MCLS Board of Directors voted to authorize me as Executive Director to seek our members' approval to sell the building and land we own at 1407 Rensen St., Lansing, MI. Our goal is to complete a successful member vote by Wednesday, Sept. 28 through an open, transparent process that complies with Michigan state law and the MCLS Bylaws. This means that we will need at least 10% of our member libraries to vote, with the majority in favor of selling.

- Eric attended both of the CALL meetings.
