Birding Presentations

Greg has led birding trips for Michigan Audubon and was on its Board of Directors for three years. Greg has birded in all of Michigan's 83 counties and in most of North America. He is excited to report he saw his 347th Michigan bird species in April 2022, a Say's Phoebe at Tawas Point State Park. Greg has been a winner in multiple amateur photo contests including the overall winner in Michigan Nature Association's Photo Contest in both 2020 and 2021!

Greg now enjoys delivering birding and nature education presentations to audiences throughout Michigan. Both live and virtual, the presentations have received excellent reviews and earned many recommendations.

4. Lotion Making Workshop: Sick of summer dry skin? Not looking forward to that winter scaly skin? Maybe you happen to be allergic to many lotions. This is just the class for you! You will learn what goes into making a quality moisturizing lotion that you can use every day. Learn what oils can help your skin or make that flakiness even worse and which additives can help you (and make your lotions uniquely yours). Instructor provides all ingredients, containers, handouts, and utensils needed for the class. Library will need to provide electricity, extension cords and access to a microwave. Adults & Teens over age 15 only. Limited to 20 students.

5. **Body Butter Workshop:** In this class students will learn how to make a rich, smooth scented body butter that is perfect for your own medicine cabinet, or a giftable item for others. Students will learn how to blend natural butters and oils and their benefits when used on our skin. Body butters help to seal in moisture and protect tender skin from the elements. Instructor provides all ingredients, containers, handouts, and utensils needed for the class. Library will need to provide electricity, extension cords, access to a microwave and if possible, a sink.

6. **Basic Earrings and Necklace Class:** In this class students will make a pair of earrings and a necklace. This is an introductory course, students will make a pair of earrings using a headpin or eyepin to place their selected beads onto. The necklace will be simple in design, students will select beads to slide onto the chain and will have the option to make a drop or pendant. This class will require some dexterity as students will be using needle nose pliers and other small hand tools to craft their earrings and necklace. Instructor provides all supplies - beads, jewelry findings, chains, etc.

7. Native American Style Choker Making Class: In this class students will learn how to make a 3 or 4 strand choker; including cutting the leather and sinew, selecting the beads and laying out the designed pattern. Instructor provides all supplies; hair pipe beads (bone or horn), crow beads (ceramic or glass), artificial sinew and leather spaces & ties. Students will need to be careful as we will be using sharp needles and scissors!

8. **Dream Catcher Making Class:** In this class students will learn how to make a dream catcher; including wrapping hoop (choice of leather or embroidery thread), cutting leather & sinew, selecting beads & feathers and learning how to weave the pattern of the dream catcher.
